PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The past year has seen a return to a more normal state of affairs now that COVID-19 seems to be behind us. During the year, MOW has continued to deliver meals and check on the well-being of our clients. All told, we delivered 101,520 meals to 1544 total clients.

We thank our team of 261 dedicated volunteers for delivering meals, assisting in the office and serving on the Board of Directors. That said, MOW still is confronting a continuing shortage of volunteers and the ongoing challenge of recruiting additional volunteers.

MOW, in the early part of the year, experienced a major turnover of staff. As the year wore on, the new staff members settled into their positions and are now proving to be a major asset to the organization. We are deeply appreciative of the excellent service all our staff are providing to our clients.

In 2010, the Ontario Legislature passed the Ontario Not-for-Profit Act, 2010, (ONCA). However, ONCA was not proclaimed until 2021 At its Annual Meeting last September, the members of MOW approved the needed revisions to the articles and by-laws to bring them into conformity with the provisions of ONCA.




COVID-19 funding that was being received from the province and the City of Ottawa ended March 31, 2024. This has meant a return to regular pricing for meals on April 1st accompanied by an inflationary increase of 4%. We remain concerned about the adverse impact that this is having have on our lower-income clients and continue to advocate for increased funding from our Ministry of Health funder to offset the staggering inflation on food prices we have seen over the last few years.

As always, we greatly appreciate and thank our funders at Ontario health and the City of Ottawa plus all our generous corporate and individual donors for their continuing staunch support. Together we are making a difference in our community and will continue to do so going forward!
